MINUTES OF THE 1st WORKSHOP FOR

FINALIZATION OF METHODOLOGY AND QUESTIONNAIRE

OF THE STUDIES FINALIZED IN RAC

FOR THE WORK PLAN 2023-24 AT AERC JABALPUR, JNKVV

The workshop was held under the Chairpersonship of Adviser, AER Section, ES&E Division, DA&FW on 15-16thFebruary, 2024 at AERC Jabalpur for finalization of Methodology and Questionnaire of the studies finalized in RAC for the work plan 2023-24. The list of participants is at **Annexure-I**.

- **2.** The meeting began with lighting of the holy lamp and offering of flowers to Goddess Saraswati by the dignitaries. Then Dr. Deepak Rathi, Professor and Director (I/c), AERC Jabalpur, JNKVV welcomed Prof. P.K. Mishra, Hon. Vice Chancellor, JNKVV, Smt. Promodita Sathish, Adviser, ES&E Division, other officers from the JNKVV, officials of the Ministry, and other participants of the meeting. Then, the Hon. Vice Chancellor, JNKVV, welcomed the Adviser, ES&E Division, and other officials from the Ministry. The meeting began with a brief introductory note about JNKVV and AERC Jabalpur. Director (I/c), AERC Jabalpur then outlined the session for the two days of the workshop.
- **3.** Adviser, AER then welcomed the participants and delivered a brief introductory address on the 1st Workshop by AER Section, ES&E Division, DA&FW held at AERC Jabalpur, JNKVV. Adviser, AER then remarked that the participation of Lead Study Coordinators from CMA IIM-A and ADRTC ISEC Bengaluru should have been there to facilitate better discussions and outcome from the workshop. It has been emphasized earlier on the mandatory participation in the future meetings with respect to the studies allotted in the workplan. AERCs/Us were then requested to present their respective study proposals for discussions. The study wise comments and actions are at table in **Annexure-II.**
- **4.** After the discussions in the workshop, the following points emerged during the discussion:

A. Study related aspects

- It was informed to the AERCs/Us that the state level reports on the studies allotted can be published by the respective AERCs/Us subject to completion and acceptance of the final consolidated report by the Ministry. The state specific reports need to be in line with the acceptance of final consolidated report by the Ministry.
- The peer-review of draft reports need to much more than mere editing, and must be
 more rigorous and comprehensive, keeping in view the needs and ends of the Ministry
 from each of the studies. It was informed that before the finalization of study reports,
 the peer-reviewer must present the peer-reviewed report before Ministry to keep the
 report aligned with the Ministry.
- The state specific report must also be reviewed by the coordinating units/centres. The
 quality comments and valuable insights must be given so as to enhance quality of
 individual centres report.
- A meeting for discussion of study progress with the Joint Secretaries of the respective Divisions of DA&FW to be tentatively scheduled in 1st week of April, 2024 to ensure the study progresses on lines of the Division's requirements and thrust areas, among others.
- It was emphasized to focus on the primary level field data to elicit feedback, along with inclusion of a global perspective and success stories from the ground to be highlighted in both the study report and policy brief.

- It was emphasized the AERCs/Us to stick to the timeframe of December 2024 for completion of all the final consolidated studies allotted in the workplan 2023-24 for maintaining relevance of the study findings and recommendations.
- It was stressed to complete the pending studies and the AERCs/Us (AERU ADRTC ISEC Bengaluru and AERC VV Nagar, SPU) were requested to complete the pending studies at the earliest. The rest of the AERCs/Us were requested to publish the hard copies of the final study report and submit the same to the Ministry for circulation among the stakeholders.
- All the Lead Coordinators of the coordinating AERCs/Us need to hold meetings at regular intervals to in order to handhold, guide and coordinate the participating centres, and to monitor the progress at different stages of the study.

B. Other matters

- Various administrative matters of the AERCs/Us were also discussed. AERCs/Us requested that the communication with respect to administrative and other issues to be sent by Ministry to take requisite action from time to time. The reminder communication to that effect may again be sent to the AERCs/Us concerned.
- It was suggested that the Centres under State Agricultural Universities face pertinent but somewhat different issues and the same need to be looked into specifically.

The timeline of actions decided for studies is at Annexure-III.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

- The study proposals was discussed and it was decided that:
- CMA IIM-A to discuss the proposals with AERCs/Us with regard to the sample coverage and earmark specific Millet to each of the state covered. Also, it was decided the requirement of the Crops Division, DA&FW to include Psuedo millets in the study must be met. However, on the suggestion offered by AERC Shantiniketan, Visva Bharati University, the state of West Bengal to be dropped based on the low coverage under Millets in the state.
- It was suggested that primary surveys of exporters, consumers, other stakeholders to be undertaken to bring out the ground reality in the Millet sector.
- It was also decided that APY data need to be provided by respective AERCs for 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 at District Level.
- Adviser AER instructed to keep the study title in line with the one finalized in the Directors Meeting.
- It was suggested to look in to the tribal aspects of other relevant states as well, and not restricting it to Andhra Pradesh only.
- AERC Delhi agreed to share the relevant data on NFSM from the earlier study with CMA IIM-A.

• Lastly, based on the suggestions/comments in the discussion, it was decided that CMA IIM-A to revise the study proposal based on the suggestions of the AERCs/Us and clearly specify Millets earmarked for AERCs/Us to facilitate in the survey.
