## MINUTES OF THE 4<sup>th</sup> MEETING OF RESEARCH ADVISORYCOMMITTEE (RAC) HELD ON 19<sup>TH</sup> JULY, 2023 UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SECRETARY, DA&FW

The Fourth meeting of Research Advisory Committee (RAC) was held in person under the Chairmanship of Shri Manoj Ahuja, Secretary (DA&FW) on 19<sup>th</sup>July, 2023 at 6:00 P.M. in room no 142, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi for consideration and approval of research study proposals received for work plan 2023-24. The list of participants is at **Annexure-I**.

- 2. At the outset, Sr. ESA welcomed the chair, RAC members and other participants. The meeting began with a brief introductory note on the purpose of the RAC meeting and invited Member Secretary, RAC/Adviser (AER) to make a presentation on the Agro-Economic Research (AER) Scheme and new study proposals to be placed before RAC.
- **3.** A detailed presentation was made by Adviser, AER on the agenda 4<sup>th</sup> RAC meeting, the working of AER Scheme and its objectives. Committee was also explained about mandate and composition of RAC.
- 4. Secretary, DA&FW enquired about the criteria for approval of study proposals. Adviser, AER clarified that the Committee may consider the study proposal if no similar study was conducted in the preceding three years under AER scheme, secondly if the proposal is on currently relevant agroeconomic issue and thirdly, if it pertains to issue/(es) of special interest. Further, the Committee was also informed about status of studies allotted in the previous work plan. Out of 21 studies allocated in work 2021-2022, only 5 are pending, however, are nearing completion. For 2023-24 work plan, a total of 38 proposals have been received from various Divisions of DA&FW (6 Nos.), allied Ministries (9 Nos.), Agro-Economic Research Centres and Units (AERCs/Us) (23 Nos.) for consideration and approval of RAC. Adviser, AER thereafter, presented the new study proposals one by one covering title of the study, objectives, coverage/scope etc. for consideration of the RAC.
- **5.** Secretary, DA&FW stressing on the importance of AER studies in policy formulation, emphasized that RAC needs to be organized annually and suggested to institutionalize the feedback/impact assessment of schemes. He also stressed that the studies by AERCs should throw insight into farmers perspectives on different aspects of schemes/agrarian issues.
- **6.** Chairman, CACP emphasized that the focus area of research studies should be on performance evaluation of various schemes. The primary aim of these studies is to provide continuous feedback for assessing ground situation and for policy formulation/intervention. The study should undertake primary survey. It was pointed out that concurrent feedback/impact assessment of schemes is under progress.
- 7. During the meeting, it was suggested that the research study proposals may be on the following broad themes;
  - •Millets-farmers' perspective
  - •Crop insurance-RWBCIS
  - Agriculture Infrastructure Fund
  - •Micro-irrigation

- •e-NAM
- Price Support
- PM Kisan
- •Credit issues of farmers
- Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs)/Farmer's collectives

The study and its specific objective may be chosen within these broad themes. It was advised that AERCs/Us may be given flexibility to choose specific issues from the broad themes which are relevant for policymaking and implementation. RAC may also approve broad area of study and the detail of study proposal may be fine tuned and finalized in the Director's meeting.

- **8.** A total of 11 research study proposals were approved by RAC and suggestions/comments on area coverage, scope, objectives etc. on specific proposals were offered by the Committee. Comments on study proposals placed before RAC are at **Annexure II**.
- **9.** The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
